


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HISPANIC-WHITE EQUALITY INDEX COMPARISON > 2000 VS 2020 (Under 2000 Weights)

We estimate an index for each category that can be interpreted in the same way as the total Equality Index. So, an index of 63.0% for the economics category for Hispanics in 2000 means that Hispanics are missing close to half of the economics mini-pie. The figure summarizes the total 2000 Equality Index and the index in each category for Hispanics.
